

**REQUIREMENTS**  
**Sweepers and Award Presenters**  
**2008 United States Figure Skating Championships**

The Twin Cities Figure Skating Association, host of the 2008 United States Figure Skating Championships, will soon be selecting sweepers and award presenters for this exciting event. Applications for sweepers and award presenters will be distributed to TCFSA member club presidents and delegates on June 1, 2007. Applications will also be available online at [www.tcfsa.org](http://www.tcfsa.org). Below are the general requirements for sweepers and award presenters. Additional information about the selection process for both of these opportunities will be provided with the applications. TCFSA encourages all eligible skaters to apply.

**Requirements for Sweepers**

The job of a sweeper for the 2008 US Figure Skating Championships is to collect flowers and other gifts thrown onto the ice surface after each of the performances.

1. Must have passed Pre-Juvenile Moves in the Field test on or before June 30, 2007;
2. Must be 8 years of age on or before June 30, 2007;
3. Must be no older than 13 years of age on or before June 30, 2007;
4. Must be a continuous member of a TCFSA member club since July 1, 2006; and
5. Must be available **ANYTIME** from January 20 – 27, 2008 and follow a general code of conduct. There will also be a mandatory orientation approximately two days before the start of the Championships.

**Requirements for Award Presenters**

The job of an award presenter for the 2008 US Figure Skating Championships is to assist in the presentation of medals, gifts, and flowers at the awards ceremonies.

1. Must have passed Novice Moves in the Field test and/or completed Silver Dance level on or before June 30, 2007;
2. Must be 14 years of age on or before June 30, 2007;
3. Must be no older than 18 years of age on or before June 30, 2007;
4. Must be a continuous member of a TCFSA member club since July 1, 2006; and
5. Must be available **ANYTIME** from January 20 – 27, 2008 and follow a general code of conduct. There will also be a mandatory orientation approximately two days before the start of the Championships.
